Amazing Tape is just that... amazing. It has so many purposes around the house and sewing studio. It clings to itself so there's no residue or sticky glue left behind. I use it to wrap around my sewing threads. It holds the thread in place and I can avoid untangle thread knots. I also bundle all my electrical cords so they're nice and neat.<u>Link</u>



Thread Savers

Save those empty thread spools! If you're like me, you have a wide assortment of threads, yarns, ribbons and decorative cords. Sometimes I come across a small hank of decorative yarn or hand dyed silk ribbon. For those smaller pieces, I wind them around empty spools of sewing thread. It keeps them smooth and tagle- free.

Texture: The Artist Makes the Choice

Smooth, bumpy, rough - the artist makes the choice. Will the fabrics and quilting emphasize the subject matter of the piece or suggest texture with the use of buttons, baubles, or beads? Will the artwork be constructed using a raw edge collage method or be whole cloth with a slick feel. The artist makes the choice.

Texture can add a physical presence, visual interest or dimension to a work of art. This call for our CFG Online Gallery Exhibit asks you to enter artworks that emphasize texture. Think Pam's glorious collaged jackets, Joyce's elegant period purses, Linda's delightful fiber brooches or wall pieces using raw edge applique' by Mary A, Terry's striped triangles, and Judith's lovely hand painted and thread sketched images that all emphasize the tactile surface in their work, whether actual or implied. The artist makes the choice.

Jurying takes place by photograph. Be sure to look at the links for our Photographic Guidelines below. Submissions will be open January 1-31. We want work submitted that has not already appeared in our CFG online exhibitions. General Exhibition Guidelines can also be found in a link below. The submission form will be available January 1 and the link can be found in the November newsletter and in a special eblast you will receive close to January 1.
